




#### **GRIEF PROJECT**

# **KÄTHE KOLLWITZ**

The UConn Grief Project was inspired by the powerful art of Käthe Kollwitz (1867-1945), a German printmaker, sculptor, teacher, and social activist who used her work to oppose war and social injustice. The William Benton Museum of Art maintains a collection of more than 100 prints and drawings by Kollwitz, which are featured in the exhibition, *Käthe Kollwitz: Activism Through Art,* February 3 – April 10, 2021.




# it sits.






wrapping me in a warm, depressing **hug** it's like crawling under the smoke in a building on fire **panic** mode engaged, no light in sight you can't find the exit

and you can't stand up again




it's like turning to your left, only to stumble into a brick wall

there is no right way out, it only keeps crawling in it's a deep, pulling ache, like dark taffy in your stomach falling and sticky, you can't ever clean it up






black lungs, black heart and a home now in ashes

I live every day with an insatiable hunger for more.


more time, more memories, more moments together



seeing families still together and moms with their kids


smiling, laughing, crying any sort of emotion, any sort of moment

they still have that luxury to see the love in her eyes












to feel her warm embrace and talk about plans for the future
